Notes

- Each of the high-stressed vowels $\acute{a} \acute{e} \acute{i} \acute{o} \acute{o} \acute{u}$ has been assigned its own key. Each of the accented vowels can be found directly beneath its unaccented version. The only exception is \acute{i} which is two rows under on the m key.
- To type the θ use the left-bracket key [.
- To type the \check{c} use the **right-bracket key**].
- The glottal stop character ? is on the Slash key /.
- On Windows systems, all changed keys can type their original value by holding down the **Right-Alt key**. The letter **Z** is typed **Right-Alt+Z**. In this way, non-Native words can be typed without switching keyboards.
- On Mac systems, you can revert to the US English keyboard layout by pressing the **Caps Lock key**. Releasing the Caps Lock will make the keyboard go back to 'J'óóóníííh.
- Opening and closing quotes. For Mac users, Right-Alt is either of the Option Keys.
