
Asakiwaki (Sauk) Keyboard Layout



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Notes

- There are two versions of the Asakiwaki keyboard: one called *Accents First*. The other is *Accents Last*. It is suggested that on older computers, the *Accents First* keyboard be used because Windows generally has less trouble with this layout. However, the *Accents Last* is perhaps more intuitive for the typist and should work fine on Windows Vista and all Macs. The Mac keyboard only comes in *Accents Last*.
- On the Accents First keyboard layout, to type an accented vowel, type the accent key first then the vowel â is typed Slash / then a
- On the Accents Last keyboard layout, to type an accented vowel, type the vowel key first then the accent
 â is typed a then Slash /
- You can type the original English punctuation marks by holding down the **Right-Alt** or **Option key**. The *Slash* / is typed **Right-Alt+Slash** (Windows) **Option+Slash** (Mac).
- Opening and closing quotes. For Mac users, Right-Alt is either of the Option Keys.
 - single: 'Shift-Backquote —' Apostrophe
 - » double: "Right-Alt+7 "Right-Alt+8
 - » single < Right-Alt+Shift+9 > Right-Alt+Shift+0
 - » double « Right-Alt+9 » Right-Alt+0
