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Notes

- There are two versions of the Asakiwaki keyboard: one called *Accents First*. The other is *Accents Last*. It is suggested that on older computers, the *Accents First* keyboard be used because Windows generally has less trouble with this layout. However, the *Accents Last* is perhaps more intuitive for the typist and should work fine on Windows Vista and all Macs. The Mac keyboard only comes in *Accents Last*.
- On the *Accents First* keyboard layout, to type an accented vowel, type the accent key first then the vowel — *â* is typed **Slash /** then **a**
- On the *Accents Last* keyboard layout, to type an accented vowel, type the vowel key first then the accent — *â* is typed **a** then **Slash /**
- You can type the original English punctuation marks by holding down the **Right-Alt** or **Option** key. The **Slash /** is typed **Right-Alt+Slash** (Windows) **Option+Slash** (Mac).
- Opening and closing quotes. For Mac users, Right-Alt is either of the Option Keys.
 - » single: ‘ Shift-Backquote — ’ Apostrophe
 - » double: “ Right-Alt+7 — ” Right-Alt+8
 - » single ‹ Right-Alt+Shift+9 — › Right-Alt+Shift+0
 - » double « Right-Alt+9 — » Right-Alt+0
