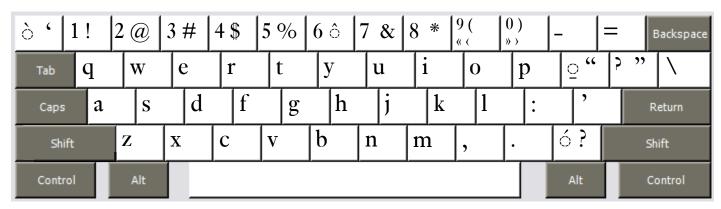
Kanien'kéha/Kanyen'kéha Keyboard



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Notes for the Vowel-First Keyboard Layout

- The Vowel-First keyboard is preferred on Macs. On Windows systems, this keyboard will limit font choice.
- All accents are typed after the base character: \acute{e} is typed \acute{e} then Slash /.
- To type the acute accent 'use the Slash key /. \acute{a} is typed a then Slash /.
- To type the grave accent `use the Grave key `. \hat{a} is typed a then Grave `.
- To type the underline accent_ use the **Left Bracket key [. n** is typed **n** then **Left Bracket [**. Always use this key to type the underline accent, **never** use your word processor's underline formatting function.

Notes for the Accent-First Keyboard Layout

- The Accent-First keyboard is preferred on Windows as it may permit some greater flexibility with fonts. However, many Windows fonts may not support the <u>n</u> character.
- All accents are typed before the base character: \acute{e} is typed Slash / then e.
- To type the acute accent 'use the Slash key /. \acute{a} is typed Slash / then a.
- To type the grave accent `use the Grave key `. \dot{a} is typed Grave ` then a.
- To type the underline accent_ use the **Left Bracket key [. n** is typed **Left Bracket [** then **n**. Always use this key to type the underline accent, **never** use your word processor's underline formatting function.

Common to both keyboard layouts

- All changed keys can type their original value by holding down the **Right-Alt** or **Option key**. The **Semi-colon**; is typed **Right-Alt+Semicolon** (Windows) **Option+Semicolon** (Mac).
- Opening and closing quotes. For Mac users, Right-Alt is either of the Option Keys.
 - □ single: 'Shift+Grave —' Apostrophe
 - □ double: "Shift+Left-Bracket "Shift+Right-Bracket
 - □ single < Right-Alt+Shift+9 > Right-Alt+Shift+0
 - □ double « Right-Alt+9 » Right-Alt+0
